HIBISCUS LASIOCARPOS

A PLANT BY MANY NAMES, THIS BEAUTIFUL CALIFORNIA NATIVE HIBISCUS IS ALSO KNOWN AS WOOLLY ROSE MALLOW, HAIRY ROSE MALLOW, DELTA HIBISCUS AND A FEW MORE. RARE IN CALIFORNIA, IT OCCURS MAINLY IN THE SACRAMENTO AND CENTRAL VALLEYS IN FRESHWATER MARSHES AND RIPARIAN ZONES. FULLY HARDY, IT IS QUITE HEAT TOLERANT, BUT DOES REQUIRE RICH, MOIST SOIL. EASY TO GROW IN AVERAGE GARDEN CONDITIONS, THIS SPECTACULAR WILDFLOWER ATTRACTS MANY POLLINATORS (HUMMINGBIRDS IN PARTICULAR!) TO ITS 5-6" DIAMETER WHITE BLOSSOMS WITH A MAROON CENTRAL EYE. BLOOMING IN MID-TO LATE SUMMER, IT TAKES CENTER STAGE WHEN MANY OTHERS HAVE FINISHED OR GROWN TIRED. A VERY SPECIAL NATIVE PLANT AND ONE TO ADD TO ANY MOIST SITE!
