SALVIA AZUREA VAR GRANDIFLORA

AKA: SALVIA PITCHERI

BLUE AS THE SKY THAT HANGS OVER THE PRAIRIES IT MAKES ITS HOME IN, THIS LATE BLOOMING SAGE PROVIDES A NECTAR SOURCE FOR POLLINATORS AT A TIME WHEN BLOOMING HAS SLOWED DOWN FOR THE SEASON. WILLOWY IS AN ADJECTIVE THAT COMES TO MIND IN DESCRIBING IT. ACCUSTOMED TO SHARING ITS HOME WITH TALL PRAIRIE GRASSES, IT HAS A TENDENCY TO LEAN ON ITS NEIGHBORS FOR SUPPORT, BUT CAN BE KEPT MORE COMPACT BY PINCHING 2 OR 3 TIMES DURING THE GROWING SEASON. DEEP ROOTED AND DROUGHT-TOLERANT, IT ALSO HOLDS UP TO HUNGRY DEER PRAIRIE SAGE IS KNOWN BY MANY NAMES; PITCHER SAGE, WILD BLUE SAGE, AND AZURE SAGE, TO NAME A FEW.
